1. It is better to learn from others' mistakes than from your own. Fables can help you with that. Fables are short tales with hidden meanings that usually use animals or lifeless objects as their main characters to illustrate (闡述) lessons on human virtues (品德) or give instructions in human behavior. Every fable has its moral lesson that can be very helpful to its readers.

For example, when something unpleasant happens, we often wonder how to avoid it. However, we must think about the consequences in advance. In a famous fable "The Ass and the Mule," written by the legendary Greek author Aesop, both animals were loaded by their master and began a long journey. They had equal loads and carried them with ease in the beginning, but when they began to ascend the steep (陡峭的) path up the mountain, the Ass could not bear his burden anymore. So, he asked the Mule to give him a hand with a small part of his load, but the Mule ignored his request. Gradually, the Ass became more and more exhausted and eventually died under his load. Not knowing what to do in the middle of the trip, the master had no choice but to put his part of the burden upon the Mule. As the Mule's load doubled, he carried it, groaning and wishing he had helped the poor Ass.

This fable not only teaches us that it is important to lend a hand to those in need but also reminds that we should think of the consequences of our actions. Indeed, an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure.
